



Cynefin: contextual complexity

COMPLEX

Cause and effect coherent in retrospect do not repeat

Pattern Management

PERSPECTIVE FILTERS

Complex Adaptive Systems

No cause and effect relationships perceivable

Stability focused intervention

ENACTMENT TOOLS

COMPLEXITY vs COMPLICATED

Can you predict with certainty the end result of the process?

NB "Hope" does not count...

THE IMPLICATIONS OF COMPLEXITY

- Small differences at the start create big differences by the end ... so different cultures require different processes
- In retrospect, we can see how, where, when and why things happened ... but prediction is impossible

PERSPECTIVE FILTERS

- Odd One Out
- Repeating patterns

 Perspective filters are based on previous experiences and on examples we have heard



ANTHROPOLOGY

- Narrative is not story but fragments
- How we define in social groups:
 - Who's in and who's out
 - What we aspire to
 - What we will tolerate and what we won't
- Homo narrans the storytelling ape

SO WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

- Understanding the population = need to understand their narratives
- Use patterns to see fixed and movable points in belief systems
 - Emergent patterns, not predicted ones
- Facts don't beat narratives
- No hard and fast way to adapt things
 - Probe, Sense, Respond

- Farmers guessing the weight of a cow at the county fair ...
 ... the average of the group is more accurate
- No one must be aware of the guesses of others
 So don't confuse this with prediction markets
- Mass consultation of citizens & interest groups
- A simple test to prove the point
 - Three students with white shirts & three with black playing basket ball
 - Count the number of times those with white shirts pass the ball
 - There are two balls!
 - To avoid argument: if it leaves the hands of someone in white and arrives in someone else's, no matter how, it is one pass






NARRATIVES

- The Grand Narrative
 - The overarching structure, based on direction and constraint
 - If over-defined, it risks being too idealistic
 - For top-down direction, not for analysis the Danger of a Single Story: http://on.ted.com/3k

NARRATIVES

- The Grand Narrative
- The local narratives
 - The individual communication coherent with the Narrative
 - Based on experience/knowledge and relevant to the local context
 - Best made up from examples in the micro-narrative environment






Update

Y axis: Conflict (conflicting to cooperating)


Z axis: Stability

Z axis: Stability




X axis: Diversity (homogenous to heterogenous)

ADVICE!

- Use examples to illustrate abstract concepts
 - Situations that will resonate
 - Recall moments of their history that have parallels (but check with someone from the culture beforehand)
- To set strategy and direction, use "more stories like this, fewer like that"
- The heroes and protagonists in the examples should be the audience
 - NATO is not a hero riding to the rescue, it is more often an ally or mentor
